

The Booke of Common prayer and administration of the Sacraments.

The order where Morning and Euening prayer shall bee vised and said.

The Morning and Euening prayer shall be vised in the accustomed place of the Church, Chappel, or Chancell, except it shal bee otherwise determined by the Ordinary of the place: And the Chauncells shall remaine as they haue done in times past,

And here is to be noted, that the Minister at the time of the Communion, and at all other times, in his ministracion, shall vise such Ornamentes in the Church, as were in vse by authority of Parliament in the second yeere of the reigne of King Edward the sixt, according to the Act of Parliament, in that case made & provided.

An order for Morning prayer dayly throughout the yeere.

At the beginning both of Morning Prayer, and likewise of Euening Prayer, the Minister shall reade with a lowd voyce, some one of these Sentences of the Scriptures that follow: And then hee shall say that which is written after the said sentences.

Ezek.18.
v.22.

A* what time soever a sinner doeth repente him of his sinne from the botome of his heart, I will put all his wickednesse out of my remembraunce, saith the Lord.

Psal.51.3.

*I doe know mine owne wickednesse, and my sinne is alway against me.

Psal.51.9.

*Turne thy face away from our sinnes, (O Lord) and blot out all our offences.

Psal.51.17.

*A sorrowfull spirit is a sacrifice to God: despise not (O Lord) humble and contrite hearts.

Joel.2.13.

*Rent your hearts and not your garmentes, and turne to the Lord your God, because he is gentle and mercifull, he is patient, and of much mercy, and such a one that is sorie for your afflictions.

Dan'9.9,10

*To thee (O Lord God) belongeth mercy and forgiuenesse, for wee haue gone away from thee, and haue not hearkened to thy voyce, whereby we might walke in thy Lawes which thou hast appointed for vs.

Ier.10.24,
psal.6.1.

*Correct vs (O Lord) and yet in thy iudgement, not in thy furie, lest wee should be contumy & brought to nothing.

Math.3.2.

*Amend your liues, for h[is] kingdom of God is at hand. I will goe to my father, and say to him, Father, I haue sinned against heaven and against thee: I am no more worthy to be called thy Sonne.

*Enter not into iudgement with thy servants, O Lord: for no flesh is righteous in thy sight.

*If we say that wee haue no sinne, wee deceipte our selues: and their is no truthe in vs.

Dearly beloued bretheren, the Scripture mooneþ us in sundry places, to acknowledge and confesse our manifold sinnes and wickednesse, and that wee shoulde not dissemble nor cloake them before the face of Almighty God our heavenly Father: but confess them with an humble, lowly, penitent, and obedient heart, to the end that wee may obtaine forgiuenesse of the same by his infinite goodnesse and mercy. And althoough we ought at all times humbly, to acknowledge our sinnes before God: yet ought we most chiefly so doe, when we assemble & meete together, to render thanks for the great benefites, that we haue received at his hands, to set forth his most worthy praise, to heare his most holy word, & to alre the thynge which he requireþ & necessarly, as wel for the body as the soule. Wherefore I pray and beseech you as many as be heere present, to accompanye mee with a pure heart and humble voyce unto the throne of the heavenly grace, saying after me.

*A Generall confession to bee said of the whole Congregation after the Minister, kneeling.

A Lmighty and most mercifull Father, we haue erred and strayed from thy wayes like lost sheepe, we haue followed too much the deuices and desires of our own hearts: we haue offended against thy holy Lawes: we haue left undone those things which wee ought to haue done, and we haue done those things which wee ought not to haue done, and there is no health in vs: but thou, O Lord, haue mercy vpon vs miserable offendours. Spare thou them, O God, which coselle their faults: Restore thou them that be penitent, according to thy promises declared into mankinde in Christ Jeſus our Lord: and grant, O most mercifull Father, for his sake, that we may hereafter liue a godly, righteous and sober life, to the glory of thy holy Name. Amen.

*The absolution or remission of sinnes to be pronounced by the minister alone.

A Lmighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesuſ Christ, which desirer̄ not the death of a sinner, but rather that he may turne from his wickednes, and sinne, and hath giuen power and commandement to his Ministers, to declare & pronounce to his people being penitent, the absolution and remission of their sinnes, he pardoneth & absolveth all them which truly repente, and daſtainedly beleue his holy Gospell. Wherefore we beseech him to grant vs true repentance and his holy Spirit, that those things may please him which wee doe at this present, & that the rest of our life hereafter may bee pure and holy, so that at the last we may come to his eternall joy, through Jesuſ Christ our Lord.

The people shall answere.

Amen.

*Then shall the Minister begin the Lords prayer with a lowd voyce.

O ur Father which art in heauen, hallowed be thy Name. Thy Kingdome come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heauen. Give vs this day our dayly bread. And forgiue vs our trespasses, as we forgiue them that trespass agaist vs. And leate vs not into temptation. But deliuer vs from euill. Amen.

*Then likewise he shall say.

And our mouth shall shew forth thy prayse.

Morning prayer.

Praise ye the Lord.

¶ Then shall be said or sing this Psalme following.
O Come, let us sing unto the Lord : let us heartily
reioye in the strength of our saluation.
Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving:
and shew our selues glad in him with Psalms.

¶ For the Lord is a great God : and a great King above all gods.

In his hand are all the corners of the earth : and the strength of his hys is also.

The sea is his, and hee made it : and his hands prepared the dry land.

O come, let us worship and fall downe : and kneele before the Lord our maker.

¶ For he is the Lord our God : and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheepe of his hands.

To day if yee will heare his voyce, harden not your hearts : as in the prouocation, and as in the day of temptation in the wilderness.

Sixty yeres long was I grieved with this generation, & laid : it is a people that doe erre in their hearts, for they haue not knowne my wyes.

¶ Then shall follow certayne Psalmes in order, as they be appointed in a Table made for that purpose, except there be proper Psalmes appointed for that day.

And at the end of every Psalme throughout the yere, and likewise in the end of Benedicats, Benedicite, Magnificat, and Nunc dimittis shall be repeated.

Glorie be to the Father, and to the Sonne &c. As it was in the beginning. &c.

¶ Then shalbe read two Lessons distinctly with a lond voyce, that the people may heare. The first of the old Testament, The lecond of the New, like as they bee appointed in the Kalender, except there be proper Lessons assigned for that day. The Minister that readeh the Lesson, standing, and turning him so, as hee may best be heard of all such as be present. And before every Lesson, the Minister shall say thus ; The 1.

2. 3. or 4. Chapter of Genesis, or Exodus, Mathew, Marke, or other like, as is appointed in the Kalender. And in the end of every Chapter hee shall say,

Here endeth such a Chapter of such a Booke.

¶ And (to the end the people may the better heare,) in such places where they doe sing, there shal the Lesson be sing in a plaine tune, after the maner of distinct reading : and likewise the Bristle and Gospel.

¶ After the first lesson, shall follow Te Deum in English dayly through the whole yere.

VV Praise thee, O God : we knowledge thee to bee the Lord.

All the earth doeth worship thee : the Father eu-
erlasting.

To thee all Angels cry a lond : the heauens and all the powers therin.

To the Cherubin & Seraphim continually doe cry.

Holy, holy, holy : Lord God of Sabaoth.

The goodly fellowship of the Prophets : praise thee.

The noble armie of Martys : praise thee.

O God, which art autho[r] of peace, and louer of concord, in knowledge of whom standeth our eternall life, whose seruice is perfitt freedome: defend vs by thy humble seruantes in all assaults of our enemies, that we surely trusting in thy defens, may not feare the power of any aduersaries, through the might of Iesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

¶ The third Collect for grace.

O Lord our heavenly Father, Almighty and everlastinge God, which hast safelie brought vs to the beginning of this day, defend vs in the same with thy mighty power, and graunt that this day we fall into no shame, neither come into any kinde of danger, but that all our doings may be ordered by thy gouernance, to doe alwayes that is righteous in thy light, through Iesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

God, from whom all holy desies, all good coun-
sels, and all iust wokes doe proceed: giue unto
thy seruants that peace whiche the world cannot giue,
that both our hearts may be set to obey thy Comman-
dements, and also that by thee we being defended from
the feare of our enemies, may passe our time in rest and
quietnesse, through the merites of Jesus Christ our
Sauiour. Amen.

Lighteu our darkenesse, we beseech thee, O Lord,
and by thy great mercy defend vs from all perils,
and dangers of this night, for the loue of thy onely
Sonne our Sauiour Jesus Christ, Amen.

W^Ho soever will bee saued before all things it is necessary that he hold the Catholike faith. Whiche faith except every one do keepe whole and un-
deiled: without doubt he shall perish euerlastingly.

And the Catholike faith is this: that wee worship one God in Trinity, and Trinity in Unitie.

Neither confounding the persones; nor dividing the substance.

For there is one person of the Father, another of the Sonne: and another of the holy Ghost.

But the Godhead of the Father, of the Sonne, and of the holy Ghost, is all one: the glory equall, the Ma-
lestie coeternal.

Such as the Father is, such is the Sonne: and such is the holy Ghost.

The Father increate, the Sonne increate; and the holy Ghost increate.

The Father incomprehensible, the Sonne incom-
prehensible: and the holy Ghost incomprehensible.

The Father eternall, the Sonne eternall; and the holy Ghost eternall.

And yet they are not three eternals: but one eternall.

As also there be not three incomprehensibles, nor three in-
created: but one increated, & one incomprehensible.

So likewise the Father is Almighty, the Sonne Almighty: and the holy Ghost Almighty.

And yet they are not three Al mighty: but one Al-
mighty.

So the Father is God, the Sonne is God: and the holy Ghost is God.

And yet they are not three Gods: but one God.

So likewise the Father is Lord, the Sonne Lord: and the holy Ghost Lord.

And yet not three Lords: but one Lord.

For like as we be compelled by the Christian veritie to acknowledge every perso by himself to be God & Lord.

So are wee forbidden by the Catholike Religion: to say there be three Gods, or three Lords.

The Father is made of none: neither created, nor begotten.

The Sonne is of the Father alone: not made, nor created, but begotten.

The holy Ghost is of the Father, & of the Son: nei-
ther made, nor created, nor begotten, but proceeding.

So there is one Father, not three Fathers, one Son, not three Sons: one holy Ghost, not three holy ghosts.

And in this Trinitie none is afore or after other: none is greater or lesse then another.

But the whole three persons be coeternal together: and coequall.

So that in all things as is aforesaid: the Unitie in Trinity, and the Trinity in Unity is to be worshipped.

He therefore that will be saues: must thus thinke of the Trinitie.

Furthermore it is necessary to euerlasting salua-
tion: that wee also beleue rightly in the incarnation of our Lord Iesus Christ.

For the right faith is, that we beleue and confess: that our Lord Iesus Christ, the Sonne of God, is God and man.

God of the substance of the Father, begotten before the worldes: and man of the Substance of his mother, borne in the world.

Perfect God and perfect man: of a reasonable soule, and humane flesh subsisting.

Equal to the Father as touching his Godhead: and inferiour to the Father touching his manhood.

Who although he be God and man: yet hee is not two but one Christ.

One, not by conversion of the Godhead into flesh: but by taking of the manhood into God.

One altogether, not by confusio[n] of Substance but by unitie of person.

For as the reasonable soule and flesh is one man: so God and man is one Christ.

Who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell: rose againe the third day from the dead.

He ascended into heaven, he sitteth on the right hand of the Father, God Almighty: from whence he shall come to judge the quicke and the dead.

At whose coming all men shal rise againe with their bodies: and shall give account for their owne works.

And they that haue done good shall goe into life everlasting: and they that haue done euill, into ever-
lasting fire.



Most mighty God, mercifull and loving Father, I wretched sinner come unto thee in the Name of thy dearely beloued Sonne Iesus Christ, my onely Sauour and Redemer: and most humbly beseeche thee for his sake to bee mercifull unto mee, and to cast all my shames out of thy sight and remembrance, through the merites of his bloody death and passion.

Poure upon mee (O Lord) thy holy Spirit of wisdom & grace: Soverene and leade me by thy holy Way, that it may bee a lantern unto my feete, and a light unto my steps. Show thy mercy upon mee, and so lighten the naturall blindnesse and dartenesse of my heart through thy grace, that I may daily be renewe by the same Spirit and grace: by the which (O Lord) purghe the grosseenesse of my hearing and understanding, that I may profitably reade, heare, and understand thy word and heavenly will, beleue and practise the same in my life and conseruation, and evermore hold fast that blessed hope of everlasting life.

Mortifie and kill all vice mine, that my life may explee my faith in thee: mercifull heare the humble lufe of thy servant, & grant me thy peace al my dayes: graciously pardon mine iniurietes, and defend me in all dangers of body, goods, and name: but chiefly my soule, against all assailes, temptations, accusations, subtilties and sleights of that olde enemie of mankind, Satan he roving upon, euer seeking whom he may deuoure.

And here (O Lord) I prostrate, with most humble ministracion of thy diuine Majestie, to be mercifull unto the universall Church of thy Sonne Christ: And especially according to my bounden dutie beseeche thee for his sake to blesse, save and defend the princi-pall member thereof, thy servant our most deare and soueraigne Lord King Charles, in his royall heart true faith, godly zeale, and loue of the same: And grant him victorie over all his enemies, a long, prosperouſ and honourable life upon earth, a blessed end, and life everlasting.

Besouer, O Lord, grant unto his maiesties, most honourable counsellours, and every other member of this thy Churche of England, that they and we in our severall callings, may truly & godly serue thee Plant in our hearts trusse and honour of thy Name, obediencie to our Prince, and loue to our neighbours: Increase in us true faith and Religion: Replenish our minds with all goodnesse, and of thy great mercy keepe us in the same till the end of our liues: Give unto us a godly zeale in prayer, true humilitie in prosperitie, perfect patience in aduersitie, and continuall joy in the holy Ghost.

And lastly, I command unto thy fathery protection, althat thou hast ginen me, as wife, children, and seruants: Alde me, O Lord, that I may gouerne, nourishe, and bring them up in thy feare and service. In some am I borne and conceiu'd there is no goodnes in me, in al much as if thou shouldest enter into thy narro w judgement with me, judging me according unto the same, I were never able to suffer & abide it, but must needs perish, and be damned for ever: No little helpe, comfort, or succour is there either in me, or in any other creature. Only this is my comfort (O heavenly Father) that thou dost not spare thy only deare beloued Sonne, but vndist give him vs unto the most bitter, and most vnde and dangerous death of the croesse for me, that he might loose the ranosome for my sinnes, satissle thy iudgement till & pacifie thy wrath, reconcile me againe unto thee, and purchase me thy grace and favour, and everlasting life. Wherefore through the merit of his most bitter death and passion, and through his innocente bloueding, I beseech thee, O heavenly Father, that thou wouldest haue to be gracious and merciful vnto me, to forgive and pardon mee of all my sinnes, to lighte my heart with thy holy spirit, to renew, confirme, & strengthen me with a right & a perfect faith, and to inflame me in loue toward thee and my neighbour, that I may henceforth with a willing and glad heart, walke as it becometh me, in thy most godly Commandments, and so gloriſſe and praye thee euerlastingly. And also that I may with a free conscience & quiet heart, in all manner of temptations, afflictions, & necessities, & even in the very pangs of death, cry boldy and mercy unto thee, and say, I believe in God ch: Father Almighty, maker of heauen and earth, and in Iesus Christ, &c. But, O Lord our heavenly Father, to comfort my selfe in affliction and temptation with these Articles of the Christian faith, it is not in my power, for faith is thy gift: and so much as thou wouldest praye unto me called upon for it: I come unto thee, to pray and beseech thee, both for that and for all other my neare liues, even as thy deare beloued Sonne our Savour Iesus Christ himselfe hath taught vs. And from the

very bottome of my heart I cry and say, Our Father which art in heauen, hallowed be thy Name, &c.

All possible thankes that we are able, wee render unto thee, O Lord Iesus Christ, for that thou hast willed this night past, to bee prosperous unto vs: and wee beseech thee likewise to prosper all this same day unto vs for thy glory, and for the health of our soule, and that thou which art the true Light, not knowing any going downe, and which art the Sunne eternall, giuing life, force & gladnesse into all things, vouchsafe to shine into our mindes, that wee may not any where humble ſelfe to fall into any ſinne, but may through thy good guiding and conduicting, come to the like euerlasting. Amen.

O Lord Jesu Christ, the onely tray and fence of our mortallitie, our onyl hope, our onyl saluacion, our glory, and our triumph, who in the flesh (which thou hadst for our only cause taken vpon thee) diddest suffer thy selfe to be tempted of Satan, and who onely and alone of all men didst vterly overcome and vanquish sin, death, the world, the devill, and all the kingdome of hell: and whatsoeuer thou hast so overcommed, for our behoofe it is that thou hast overcommed it; neither hath it been thy will to haue any of thy servants to keape battell, or fight with any of the sofelas eviles, but of purpose to reward vs with accowne of the more glori for it. And to the intent that thou myghtest likewise ouerthow Satan in thy members, as thou hast alone done in thine owne person, give thou (wee deelech thee) vnto vs thy soldiery (O Lyon most victorious of the tribe of Juda) strength against the roaring Lion, which continually wandeth to and fro, seeking whom he may devoure. Thou being that tame Serpent, the true gifter of health and life, that waknayled on high vpon a tree, giue unto vs thy silly ones, wisnes against the deceitfull awaiting of the most subtil Serpent. Thou beeing a Lambe as white as snow, the vanquisher of Satans tyranny, giue unto vs thy little sheepe the strength and vertue of thy Spiriit, haue being in our own selues weake and feble, and in their strong and valiant, we may withstand and overcome all assaults of the devill, so that our godly enemie maynot glori on vs, but beeing conquerred through thee, wee may giue thankes to thy mercie, which never leaueth them delitute that put their trust in thee, who liuest and reignest God for ever without end. Teach me so to pray, that my petitions may bee graciously heard of thee. Keepe me upright among diversities of opinions and iudgements in the world, that I never swerve from thy truthe taught in holy Scripture. In prosperitie, O Lord, save me that I wax not prou. In aduersitie help me, that I neither despaine, nor blasphem thy holy name, but taking it patiently, to give thee thankes, and trust to bee delivred after thy pleasure. When I happen to fall into shame through frailtie, I deelech thee to worke true repenteance in my heart, that I may bee sone without desperation, truthe in thy mercie without presumption, that I may amend my life, and become truly religiouse without hypocritise, lowly in heart without faining, faithfull and trustie without deceit, merrie without lighenesse, sad without mistrust, sober without stochfulness, content with mine owne without covetousnesse, to tell my neighbour his faults charitably without dissimulation, to instruct my household in thy lawes truly, to obey our King, and all gouernours under him lawfully, to receive al lawes and common ordinances (which disagree not from the holy word) obediency, to pay every man that which I owe unto him truely, to backbite no man, no flander my neighbour secretly, and to abhorre all vice, louing all goodness earnestly. O Lord grant me thus to doe, for the glori of thy holy Name. Amen.

A prayer for patience in trouble.

How hast thou (O Lord) humbled and plucked me to thee, for thou art angry wiſe me, but not without my deserving. Certaintly I haue sinned, Lord, I confesse it: I wil not denies it: but oh my God, pardon my trespasses, release my debts, render unto thy grace again unto mee, stoppe my wounds, for I am all to plague and

and beaten: yet Lord, this notwithstanding, I abide patiently, & give mine attendance on thee, continually waiting for relief at thy hand, and that not without skill, for I haue received a token of thy fauour and grace toward me, I meane thy word of promise concerning Christ, who for me was offered on the Crosse for a ransome, a sacrifice and price for my sins: wherefore according to that thy promise, defend me Lord by thy right hand, and give a gracious eare to my requests, for all mans staves are but bane. Beate donece therefore mine enemies thine owne selfe with thy power, which art my onely aider and protectour, O Lord God Almighty. Amen.

¶ A prayer to be said at night going to bed.

O Mercifull Lord God heauenly Father, whether we sleepe or wake, live or die, wee are always thine. Wherefore I beseech thee heartily, that thou wile vouchsafe to take care and charge of mee, and not to suffer me to perish in the workes of darkenesse, but to kindle the light of thy countenance in my heart, that thy godly knowledge may daily increase in me through a right & pure faith, and that I may alwayes be found to walke and live after thy will and pleasure, through Iesus Christ our Lord and Sauour. Amen.

¶ A prayer to be said at the hour of death.

O Lord Iesu, which art the only health of all men living, and the everlasting life of them whiche die in faith: I wretched sinner giue and submit my selfe wholly unto thy most blessed will. And being sure that the thing cannot perish which is committed unto thy mercy, willingly now I leau this fraile & wicked flesh in hope of the resurrection: which in better wise shall restored itto me againe. I beseech thee, most mercifull Lord Iesu Christ, that thou wile by thy grace make strong my soule against all temptation, and that thou

wile couer and defend me with the buckler of thy mercy against all the assaults of the devill. I see I knowledge that there is in my lese no hope of saluation, but all my confidence, hope, and trut is in thy most mercifull goodnesse. I haue no merits nor good workes which I may alledge before thee. Of times and chaff workes (alas) I haie a great heape, but though thy mercy I trut to be in the number of them to whom thou wile not impute their times, but take and accept me for righteous and just, and to be the inheritor of euerlasting life. Thou mercifull Lord, walke bothe for my sake, thou diddest suffer both hunger and thirst for my sake, thou diddest preach and teach, thou diddest pray and fast for my sake, thou diddest all good workes and deedes for my sake, thou sufferedst most grievous paines and tormentes for my sake. And finally, thou gauest thy most precious body to die, and thy blood to be shed on the Crosse for my sake. Now most mercifull Sauour, let all these things profit mee, which thou freely haft giuen me, that hath giuen thy selfe for mee. Let thy blood cleanse and wash away the spots and soulenesse of my sinnes. Let thy righteousnesse hide and couer mine unrighteousnesse. Let the merits of thy passion and blood be the satisfaction for my sinnes. Give me Lord, thy grace, that my faith and salvation in thy blood wante not in mee, but bee ever firme and constant, that the hope of thy mercy and life euerlasting never decay in mee, that charitie waxe not cold in mee. Finally, that the weakenesse of my flesh be not overcome with the feare of death. Grant me, mercifull Sauour, that when death hath shut vp the eyes of my body, yet that the eyes of my soule may still behold and looke vpon thee, that when death hath taken away the vse of my tongue and speach, yet that my heart may cry and say vnto thee, In manus tuas Domine, commendo spiritum meum, (that is to say) O Lord, into thy hands I giue and commit my soule: Domine leiu, accipe spiritum meum: Lord Iesu, receive my soule vnto thee. Amen.
